NUMERACY IN ACTION!

Money makes the world go round...

Confidence in dealing with money is perhaps one of the most important skills we need to develop in our students.

Nationwide: This is a collection of worksheets and fact sheets. I particularly like Money Matrix game.

Adding up to a Lifetime: A great set of video activities that cover a range of topics. Perfect to use in tutor time to raise financial awareness.

Real Hustle Video: A great video showing how customers are short changed. It would be good to show and emphasise the importance of checking change. Feel free to make up some questions to put on the board on change.

"Funny Money" App: A free app where students have to count money quickly.

Woodlands Maths Zone: There are many resources in the money section, they range from games that can be projected on the board to worksheets calculating how much

money is displayed. Perfect for lower ability students.

BBC Skillswise - Right Change: A neat game that students can play on PCs or can be projected.

History of Money: A factual video about the origins of money. Good for a history lesson or for more able students.

Money AGT: Questions based on compound interest and clip from a movie.

COUNTING MONEY GAME

How can I promote the understanding of dealing with money in my subject?

Tutor Time/Time fillers in lessons:

- Write some prices on the board, some in pence (35p) and some in pounds (£1.25). Ask students to add them or order them. To make more interactive, get two students to the board at a time and have a first to touch the answer competition with the winner staying on. e.g. first person to hit the value that is 20pence plus 10pence plus 5pence, so they hit the 35p etc.
- Use the [Adding up to a Lifetime](#) resources which are amazing! Topics include: Life as a student, working life, relationships, new life, active retirement.

Business Studies: Various concepts that are useful to teach/recap. Some would be: interest, VAT, comparing phone tariffs, loan

repayments, budgeting etc. Starters based around these would be good as well.

The [Nationwide](#) resources would be useful.

Media: Show the class the adverts from [Wonga](#) and discuss target audience and strategy when planning advert. Lead into discussion on Short-Term loans. Perhaps pause on their 4417% interest screen!

Food Tech: Ask students to tell you expected change when paying certain prices for ingredients.

Geography: As a starter, have a list of countries and a list of currencies. The students are to match the currency to the country.

MFL: Teach students to ask 'how much is...' and then get them to do roleplays with a shopkeeper. The shopper is to ask how much an item is. The shopkeeper to say the price. Shopper to say here is X euros and the shopkeeper to say how much change they will receive.

ICT: Project up two possible schemes for buying a Mac. e.g. Mac 1: Deposit £300 and 12 monthly payments of £70. Mac 2: Deposit £200 and 24 monthly payments of £40. Which is better value? For lower ability choose 10 months for both options and vary deposit and payments
